## Reflection

O Lord our God! The mystery of the Blessed Trinity is too deep for us now. But gradually the Holy Spirit will lead us to the fullness of the truth about God. Day by day we will grow in our sense of wonder that this God, who created the heavens and the earth, cares for us in an intimate, personal way. All we can do is cry out '**Glory**' to the one God, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

(Prov 8:22-31). In biblical times it was common for wisdom to be personified.

Our reading looks to the role of Lady Wisdom in creation. Though created herself, wisdom is closely associated with God's creative activity. She delights in the presence of God and is at home in the company of the human race. This speculation about wisdom can be seen as a groping towards the revelation of the mystery of the Trinity.

The second reading and the Gospel are chosen because they specifically mention the three Persons of the Blessed Trinity, and the role of each Person in our salvation.

(Rom 5: 1-5). Paul stresses the role of Christ in our salvation. Through him hostility and alienation are overcome, and we are able to enter into relationship with the Father. Therefore, we can hope to share God's glory. This hope is no mere delusion because the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit. This hope will enable us to persevere in spite of suffering.

(Jn 16:12-15). The Gospel stresses the role of the Spirit. The Spirit carries on in the Church the work of Jesus after Jesus departed to the Father. There will be no new revelation. There can't be, because Jesus is **the** revelation of the Father. The role of the Spirit will be to guide the disciples into the full meaning of what Jesus has said.
